SSV has a high percentage of 2nd grade students below grade level. We will focus on growth with all students using pathways of progress to set individual goals with students, and make a plan to support our teachers and students, especially 1st and 2nd grade

We looked at Acadience Dibels data from past years compared to this year to see that this year we are starting the year with more students below grade level due to changes in the Spring.

Data shows that the majority of students are leaving SSV reading on grade level. This is a testament to the staff and it happens over the course of their years here at SSV.

We believe that smaller class sizes are better for students. CAS has large class sizes and they are able to work together with that number. We want to keep the other sizes smaller
