2. Rob Hunter report - sidewalks:

Raptor Report (Lauren):
Purposes of Raptor - All visitors check in, all visitors screened in a sex offender database and for other flagged alerts, keeps track of all visitors to know who was in the building at what times.

We will begin using Raptor at SSV after Spring Break. Chris will email parents in the weekly email as well as independently with the information (video in english and spanish, FAQ's, letter).

A procedural guidebook for all involved staff will also be sent.

This year we plan to start the Raptor system at 9 a.m. to accommodate for students coming in late. The times will be set and run through the tech department similar to the door locks and alarms.

For assemblies or events, we can pre-register parents and pull a bulk batch of sticker name plates made ahead of time. It will go faster after the first time, once they have already scanned their id in the past.

Eventual goal of the district is to have the system at all schools and district buildings, and district staff will also check in and out.

If parents are flagged as a registered sex offender, they will be escorted by a member of the admin team.
