1. Welcome	<p>1. Attending: Teri McCabe, Parents Hayley Johnson, Karen Pharr, Carrie Prince, Kristy Harrison, Chris Chilcoat, LeeAnn Parker. Alli Williams excused. Sadness expressed for the recent passing of a former SSV student, Temu Greening</p>
2. 2023 -2024 School Land Trust Plan	<p>2. Karen Phair inquired about the focus on extra reading– What is the plan for practice and in what ways do teachers help build their skills? She has experience helping struggling students at UVU, and has seen that vocabulary and relevant material impacts their ability. She asked about extra vocabulary skill-building.</p>
3. MOY Acadience Data	<p>3. Mr. Chilcoat detailed our Acadience Reading data from BOY to MOY. Most grades making progress. 1st Grade struggling, due in part to the large class sizes, which we have addressed by hiring an additional 1st Grade teacher who began after the holiday break. Referenced the data display, which highlights grade level status AND growth progress. Our goal is focused on ensuring all students make progress. Every teacher conducts progress monitoring on each student’s area needing improvement. Ensuring that growth is linked to the Tier 1 and Tier 2 (small group focused instruction) that each student receives, including phonics instruction and blending practice. Overall as a school, we reached our growth goal (71% of students made growth).</p>
4. Goals for 2024-2025 - School Improvement Plan	<p>4. 60% chance of passing the RISE IF students are reading at “above grade level”. Only 10% if they are green (at grade level) which is in reality, bare minimum for grade level.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● ML and Special Education Data - 58% and 60% ● Lexia and Rosetta Stone being utilized. ● Kindergarten group the highest we’ve ever seen. ● “Jumpstart” - and the support of paraprofessionals. <p>Carrie Prince commented that Dixon’s Newcomer program has helped, and inquired as to our focus. At SSV, we ensure that our newcomers are connected in Tier 1, and Tier 2 instruction is focused on English-language skills. The classroom is the context for them to practice the skills, and build upon what they have learned in the language class.</p>
